

Dunchurch Parish Council crime report

For the period of November 1st until November 30th 2011:

Burglary Dwellings - 0

- Burglaries have dropped in the last three months and the Safer Neighbourhoods team continue to carry out regular patrols in the area. The 45 arrests made as a result of Operation Laser will also have contributed to this reduction in crime

Burglary other than dwelling - 2

- **Vicarage Lane** 05/11/2011
- Overnight break in to an up and over garage. Theft of off-road dirt bike
- Crime prevention advice given by SNT; after a follow up visit garage security was greatly increased

- **Linridge, Coventry Road** 11/11/2011
- Overnight break in to sheds at the rear of property. Nothing stolen
- Security of the property has been improved following Police advice

Rowdy/nuisance incidents - 3

- **Waring Way** 05/11/2011
 - Dispute between informant and an unknown male delivering pizza flyers. Male left scene before Police arrived. No offences reported

- **Bilton Lane** 06/11/2011
- Reports of drunken youths outside an address tampering with a for sale sign. Youths fled scene upon Police arrival. Officers replaced the sign

- **Dunchurch First School** 25/11/2011
- Informant reporting a disruptive farmer outside the school. Police attended although there was no trace of the farmer or the informant. Contact made with the informant via phone call who had left the scene

- Patrols carried out by the SNT in areas previously known for anti-social behaviour. There have been reports of motorbikes being ridden on Adkinson Avenue and Arkwright Park. The believed offender was stopped by Police in Hilmorton riding a motorbike with no helmet and issued a sec 59 warning

Theft from motor vehicle - 1

- Theft of number plates. Vehicle left on driveway outside home address

Further Note:

Following a spike in the number of scrap metal thefts in recent weeks, Rugby Police have engaged in a number of operations to tackle the problem. Several multi-agency operations have been carried out whereby scrap metal merchants have been pulled over and numerous checks carried out by all agencies involved. Visits have also been made to local scrap yards in conjunction with the council and appropriate checks were performed. A joint force operation with West Midlands was executed today in Coventry and rural Warwickshire, resulting in several vehicles being seized for no insurance or tax.

We continue to ask that if residents see scrap metal merchants in the area to make a record of the time and any details of the vehicle(s) being used and to pass this information on to Police.
