

Dunchurch Parish Council Crime Report

For the period of September 1st until September 30th 2011:

Burglary Dwellings – 0

- Burglaries have dropped in the last two months and the safer neighbourhoods team continue to carry out regular patrols in the area

Burglary other than dwelling - 2

- Done Cerce Close
 - 12/09/2011
 - Overnight shed break in
 - Entry gained and £500 push-bike stolen
 - Crime prevention advice given by SNT, after a follow up visit shed security was greatly increased
- Dunchurch Park Hotel
 - 05/09/2011
 - Overnight break in
 - Cash, 42" Plasma TV and digital camera stolen

Rowdy/nuisance incidents – 0

- Patrols carried out by the SNT in areas previously known for anti-social behaviour

Theft from motor vehicle – 0

- Reminder for all residents to not leave anything of value in your vehicle and particularly not to leave anything on display. Ensure that all vehicles are secure when not in them. There have been recent incidents of theft from motor vehicles left insecure in surrounding villages.

Theft of motor vehicle – 0

Theft not vehicle related – 1

- Weston Close
 - 19/09/2011
 - Push-bike stolen from side of injured party's home
 - Push-bike insecure
 - Initial enquiries negative

Criminal Damage – 2

- Vicarage Lane
 - 12/09/2011
 - 3 x flower pots "wiped off" driveway of injured party's property
 - Damage caused by vehicles using the driveway as an extension of the road because the road is blocked by parked cars
 - Reported that problem has been going on for sometime
 - SNT looking into it
- The Square
 - 08/09/2011
 - Reported that vehicle had been scratched whilst parked outside the Post Office on the Coventry Road
 - Having reviewed CCTV from the Domehawk in the Square, it was concluded that damage was not caused whilst vehicle was parked in the Square

Further Note:

There has been a spike in incidents involving the theft of Scrap Metal in recent weeks. A tasking has been created for the safer neighbourhoods team to conduct targeted patrols of potential sites for scrap metal. A two-day multi-agency operation is being set up targeting scrap metal merchants in Rugby. We ask that if residents see scrap metal merchants in the area to make a record of the time and any details of the vehicle(s) being used and to pass this information on to Police.
